Collins used \$5000 of her own money that she saved for retirement to open a school the Garfield Park neighborhood of Chicago, Illinois. Westside Preparatory School opened in 1975. She created her private school specifically to teach low income Black children who were labeled as having learning disabilities by Chicago Public schools.

In 1903 Curie developed the theory of radioactivity with her husband Pierre Curie and Henri Becquerel. She won the Nobel Peace Prize for this discover. In 1911 Curie won the Nobel Peace Prize in Chemistry for discovering the elements polonium and radium. She also developed mobile X-ray units during World War 1.
