Dear Teachers,

Now that the **Common Core State Standards** (**CCSS**) are a reality, we need to find lessons and tools that will help us prepare our students to meet those standards successfully. One area that needs consideration is vocabulary instruction. According to Marilee Sprenger, researchers estimate 85% of achievement test scores are based on the vocabulary of the standards. (Sprenger 2014) In the past, teaching vocabulary was a huge component of our reading instruction. As new reading theories have been developed and used in our classrooms, vocabulary instruction tends to appear less in our reading curriculum.

I created this Power Point presentation to help my third grade Basic Skills students learn the "critical verbs" that appear most often in the CCSS. I also wanted to integrate my vocabulary instruction with literature. I chose two of my favorite picture books:

- The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs, by Jon Scieszka, Illustrated by Lane Smith
- *June 29, 1999*, by David Wiesner

I used the books to present sample questions that use the critical verbs. This would give my students an idea of how the questions may be phrased on the **PARCC** assessment. I would then have my students practice responding to similar questions in the Student Companion using reading texts and novels.

This would be a valuable activity to help your third, fourth, fifth, and middle school students learn and use critical verbs as you prepare for the **PARCC** assessments.




